Additional information on topic areas (each area is covered in age and stage appropriate ways consistent with NSES and IL/ISBE policy)

- Consent & Healthy Relationships: Identifying and communicating with supportive adults, defining and communicating consent and boundaries, identifying qualities of a healthy friendship and healthy dating relationships for 7th grade and up.
- Gender Identity & Sexual Orientation: We call these workshops "Gender Upstanders."
 They cover diversity of families, identifying and challenging harmful gender stereotypes,
 resisting homophobia and transphobia, and creating safe, supportive classroom and school
 environments (ensuring LGBTOIA) youth know the resources for support in their school and
 community, that teachers have the tools to be supportive adults, and that all students have
 practice being upstanders for each other).
- Puberty & Reproductive Systems: These workshops include body awareness, personal
 hygiene, common physical, social, and emotional changes of puberty, normalizing the
 diversity of bodies and paths through puberty, ensuring that students of all genders receive
 all puberty and reproductive system information (increasing empathy across genders and
 bodies and ensuring that transgender and intersex youth receive relevant information).
- Sexual Health & Health Decision Making: These workshops include prevention of sexually transmitted infections and unintended pregnancy. Workshops promote medically accurate knowledge, build skills to postpone sexual activity and to negotiate safer sexual activities, and to increase access to STI testing, treatment, and contraceptives. Our approach to sexual health is focused on the rights of all people to bodily autonomy (including the knowledge and resources to support lifelong sexual health on their own terms).
- Never Fear Talks: Sexual Health Education at Home! Are you wondering what is covered in Sexual Health Education in K-12th at school? Looking for more information on supporting your child at home around topics like consent, boundaries, safe/unsafe touch, gender stereotypes, puberty...
