RETAKE & LATE WORK POLICY


Late work must be submitted within two weeks of the initial assignment due date. Work not turned in on the due date will earn a:

- -1 Week Late = 5% deduction
- -2 Weeks Late = 10% deduction

Check-Ins will not be accepted late without an excused absence. When absent, students must check Schoology and initiate contact with the teacher to set a new due date. After two weeks, if a student has not completed an assessment, a grade of 50% will be entered.

Students are eligible to retake an assessment if s/he earned less than 80% and completed corrective action, as determined by the teacher. For all writing assignments, students will be required to attend the writing center or conference with the teacher in order to revise.

Students must email the teacher once late work or revisions are resubmitted.



BOOK NOTIFICATION

As a class, we will read a variety of books that challenge individual readers and provide opportunities for everyone to explore universal concepts. We will read using literature circles to match student reading abilities and to allow for more student choice, while still encouraging class-wide discussion of larger concepts that match each of our units. To further support student learning, we will also require supplemental short stories, poetry, nonfiction articles, independent reading novels, and other media that connect via a unit's universal concept.
